### Cyclone Idai destroys livelihoods

CWS launched an <u>appeal</u> to assist nearly 3 million people affected by Cyclone Idai in Malawi, Mozambique and Zimbabwe. The storm with powerful winds and intense rain made landfall at Beira, Mozambique on March 15. <u>Called</u> one of the worst weather-related catastrophes in Africa, it left large areas underwater, landing on already saturated land and destroying drought-affected crops shortly before harvest.

As the waters recede the damage becomes more apparent as does the threat of water-borne disease. People are in urgent need of food assistance, safe water to drink and medical care. Local ACT Alliance members (Action by Churches Together) immediately responded to the need and relief supplies are being distributed. Members are finalising plans to assist communities meet their immediate needs. They will work with them towards restoring livelihoods and homes.

"We appeal to our partners and all people of goodwill to spare some resources and whatever you can to support our fellow brothers and sisters who are now struggling with life", <a href="mailto:says">says</a> Rev. On April 1, CWS launches <u>Operation Refugee 2019</u>. Life is getting harder for Syrians in Jordan and Lebanon and they are not ready to return to the fragile situation at home. Please join the challenge and tell others about it.
