#### **Read the Partner Story**

Caleb knows hope and hard work. He lost both his parents to AIDS and his sister to the typhoid she caught from the local spring. Now that his sister has gone, it is up to him to collect the water he and his grandmother need to survive. Caleb has his eyes on a new rainwater tank. His grandmother has been saving every penny she can spare so they can build their own water tank. Clean water will quench his thirst, save him from long treks to fetch water every day and prevent illness.

In this climate crisis, we are supporting partners like the Centre for Community Solidarity with our gifts and our prayers. Together we share the hope, peace, joy and love we find in Christ.

### **Lectionary Thoughts**

Hope, peace, joy, love and justice all come together on the day we have been waiting for: the day of the coming of Christ. Love is the reason the Light breaks into the darkness; justice is the means by which the darkness is conquered; hope keeps our faith strong while we wait for God's Reign to be all in all; joy and peace are the goal and fulfilment of God's purposes for us. We are invited to receive that love, work for that justice, live in that hope, and thus be covenant partners with God in bringing peace and joy to creation.

#### **Isaiah 9:2-7**

This poem was probably written 800 years before Christ, celebrating the birth of another king in the line of David. As with last week's reading, the birth was both a natural event and a sign, since the continuation of David's line was a sign of God's faithfulness. But again, as with 7:10-16, this passage was recognised as more by Jesus' followers. The hopes

pinned on this earthly and fallible leader were brought to truth and reality in Jesus. It is Jesus who truly brings light into the darkness; Jesus who is truly and eternally God; Wonderful Counsellor, Peacemaker, who upholds justice and righteousness forevermore.

#### Psalm 96

It is good, today of all days, to rejoice and sing and declare God's glory among the nations! Yet even here the ever-present theme of justice pervades the praise. Those who are praising God do so because of God's judgements. They want judgement to fall on the earth, because this is the voice of the oppressed, the poor, the lost and the abused crying out for justice and singing for joy at the certainty that it will come.

#### Titus 2:11-14

We still sometimes hear that we must choose between faith and "works". This is one of countless passages which show it is not a choice of one or the other. God's love and grace is poured out on us in Jesus so that our lives may be transformed and we may be filled with the desire to do good for others. Rejoice, yes – and do something about it!

#### Luke 2:1-14

He whaikororia ki te Atua i runga rawa Glory to God on high
He maungarongo ki runga i te mata o te whenua
Peace on earth
He whakaaro pai ki te tangata
Goodwill to all people.

These were the verses which Te Whiti of Parihaka took as his calling, and which are associated with the three-plumed Raukura. Te Whiti and his people took the Good News of Christ and made it a present reality through their non-violent resistance in the face of injustice. As Jesus arrives, born homeless, shortly to be a refugee, later to die unjustly accused, may we too channel the joy of his coming into solidarity with those experiencing injustice across our world.
