INTRODUCTION

Warm Pacific greetings,

Give Climate hope this Christmas is the theme for the CWS Christmas appeal in 2024.

The theme emerges from listening to our CWS partners in Oceania. Former Archbishop of Tikanga Pasifika, the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia, Winston Halapua speaks of a call from the world's largest ocean as "to treasure God's gift of the planet earth." Fe'iloakitau Kaho Tevi, Advisor to the current Bishop of the Diocese of Polynesia and member of Christian World Service Board, recently described oceans as our hope. "We need to make ocean front and centre of our church, the message, the preaching, the discussions, the intercessions, the prayers." A focus on climate hope this Christmas also aligns strategically with the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals, in particular Strategic Development Goal 13: Climate action.

To help resource Give Climate hope this Christmas, CWS has commissioned service outlines and preaching/teaching resources as a gift to you and those who lead worship and preach in your congregations. Over five weeks the Gospel of Luke is brought alive in conversation with restless seas, rain

gauges, soil habitats, environmental good news, New Zealand sign action songs, Ocean carols and Oceanic wisdoms of restraint.

RESOURCES

The theme makes the ocean front and centre of "the preaching, the discussions, the intercessions, the prayers." The challenge, by Fe'iloakitau Kaho Tevi, Advisor to the Bishop of the Diocese of Polynesia connects with several of the Gospel readings during Advent which mention water and creation. These environmental themes then shape what it means to Give Climate hope this Christmas

- Advent 1 Climate hope as seas roar
- Advent 2 Climate peace as earth moves
- Advent 3 Climate joy and just water
- Advent 4 Climate action songs
- Christmas Wrapped in bands of love

The service outlines and preaching/teaching resources include:

- Climate candle lighting a creation-redemption centred Advent candle lighting
- Climate Collect a public prayer that could be used during a service or following any announcements you might make about the CWS 2024 appeal
- Creative ideas that engage a range of generations and can be used as a children's talk
- CWS announcement some brief introductions as you share the work of CWS
- Songs that connect with Give climate hope and the sermon ideas
- Sermon ideas focused on the Gospel readings for Adven t in dialogue with themes of giving, Christmas and climate hope.
- Suggestions of useful short videos
- Prayers for the climate and all things
