## Operation Refugee launches



CWS has [launched Operation Refugee 2018](#), a five day challenge to live on the same food as in a refugee emergency food parcel. It is a practical way to show your support for refugees and channel much needed funds to provide food, education and medical care to those who have fled Syria. This year's challenge runs from June 16-20. Operation Refugee Lite is a two day version designed for students.

It is a simple process to [sign up](#) on line and then invite everyone you know to make a contribution. Once you raise \$87—enough to pay for a good quality food parcel in Jordan for a family of 6—we will send you the Food Box. The box contains your food for five days minus the rice. You can earn extra food to improve your diet by meeting your fundraising goals. Read more about what is involved and find cooking hints in the [Kete](#). We are asking schools, churches, individuals and businesses to join the operation to keep the lifeline going to people who have lived through unimaginable violence. ## Papua New Guinea Earthquake

A magnitude 7.5 earthquake in February was followed by 100 aftershocks, causing widespread damage and trauma in the provinces of Hela, Southern and Western Highlands. More than 150 people lost their lives and an estimated 270,000 [need](#) relief supplies. CWS is [appealing](#) for donations to provide shelter and hygiene kits, water containers, protection, psychosocial supports and other needs through ACT Alliance local church partners. Local unrest and the difficult terrain have made access difficult. Massive landslides will mean communities will need to relocate and the distribution of supplies is difficult. ## PCC Visitor

CWS was delighted to welcome the Rev François Pihaatae, the General Secretary of the [Pacific Conference of Churches](#) to the office on 13 April. CWS makes an annual grant to their programme. PCC has taken a lead on a number of regional issues, notably climate change, nuclear contamination, ending violence against women by training male advocates and self determination especially for West Papua. François says the nuclear issue is the most important. Test site Moruroa Atoll is cracking and when it collapses, it is predicted to cause a 20 metre tsunami carrying large quantities of nuclear waste. He affirmed the importance of the partnership with CWS and invited participation in their General Assembly to be held in Auckland in October.

## Tonga: NZ Government Grant

Tuna (pictured) sold bread at a roadside stall but is now grateful for a scholarship to complete her final year at Boarding School. Her father was badly injured in a petrol fire last year and is no longer able to work as a policeman. In 2016 she successfully applied for one of 14 scholarships after hearing a promotion on Maridi FM, run by CWS partner Maridi Service Agency. Less than 10% of girls finish primary school.



According to [UNICEF](#) more girls die in childbirth than finish High School. The scholarships are funded through [School for Girls](#) and the Christmas Appeal.
