

Refugees: Help is at Hand

In Europe ACT Alliance members <u>are providing</u> food, water, blankets, shelter, psycho social care and support to many refugees arriving by land or sea. They are assisting some of the people who have fled conflict in Syria, Afghanistan, Eritrea, Libya and more. CWS partner the Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees is providing relief assistance to Syrian refugees in Jordan and Lebanon, made more urgent because of cuts in UN food parcels for refugee families. Falling <u>UN funding</u> is making it tougher for families pushing many more to risk the journey to Europe.

DSPR urgently needs more funds to help. DSPR Jordan distributed food and hygiene vouchers to 220 Iraqi families after finding 98% needed food, 85% lived in unhealthy conditions, 41% needed clothes and 21% of children were out of school. The nearest public schools are filled with Syrian children. In August they provided medical care to 1670 Iraqi refugees in three health days as well as Palestinian and Syrian families. Much more is needed. **If you can please donate to the <u>Syria Appeal</u>— \$75 will provide a hygiene pack, \$90 will provide food for a family of 6.**

CWS asks Government to do more for Refugees

CWS is <u>supporting</u> the campaign to Double the Quota of refugees coming into Aotearoa New Zealand plus increased funding for humanitarian aid in the region. The decision to resettle 600 Syrian refugees is the first step, but as a member of the Security Council, New Zealand needs to do more.

Anton Marcus Visit



CWS welcomed Anton Marcus patron of the Women's Centre and joint secretary of the Free Trade Zones and General Services Employees Union earlier this month. He spoke of their work with

workers to improve working and living conditions in Sri Lanka's Free Trade Zones as well as build understanding between Tamil and Sinhala workers during and after the bitter civil war. Anton noted roads and other infrastructure were being built but factory workers were not yet paid a living wage.

South Sudan: Prayer Request

When a fuel truck overturned 16 miles from Maridi town, locals rushed to collect some of the 31,000 litres of leaking petrol. A soldier disbursed the crowd with a gunshot that exploded the tanker and claimed 196 lives, including whole families. 175 people were hospitalised in Maridi and Juba with serious burns. Those involved or who lost family are traumatised. Coming after weeks of conflict in June, Maridi Service Agency's Wadalla Peter says there is no psychosocial help available. He has humbly requested "your prayers for the poor and innocent people of MARIDI who have undergone a lot of bad moments within a short time." One of the

consequences of the June <u>conflict</u>, was that people spent more time digging in their gardens so they are hoping for good crops.



New Sustainable Agenda

On 25 September the global community will commit to a new Sustainable Development agenda. The UN will launch 17 new goals with 169 targets. The top goal is to eradicate extreme poverty. Every country will pledge to work towards the goals for the next 15 years. The <u>World Council of Churches</u> is supporting the multi-faith "Moral Imperative to End Extreme Poverty" and <u>Prayer for Everyone</u>.

Remember: Edric Baker

CWS gives thanks for the life of Edric Baker, who died 2 September in Bangladesh. A medical doctor, Edric set up a hospital and medical services in Kailakuri by training local people to deliver the services. CWS helped fund this work for some years. We remember him for his deep compassion



and commitment to a people-focused, interfaith community.
